FORT TOTTEN, ND – RedWind is thrilled to present its next two-day entrepreneurship workshop in partnership with the North Dakota Indian Business Alliance (NDIBA). This small business workshop is being hosted by the Spirit Lake Dakota Nation’s Cankdeska Cikana Community College (CCCC) located at 214 First Avenue, Room 106 in Fort Totten, North Dakota 58335 on Thursday, July 14th and Friday, July 15th , 9:00am-4:00pm.

All Native entrepreneurs are invited to attend and strongly encouraged to register for this FREE two-day course for small business development. The training workshop will benefit anyone who operates or is considering operating a small business.

This workshop, one of (15) RedWind will hold this year, will cover business concepts indispensable for anyone starting up or running a small business. Instructors will also identify and help participants avoid common pitfalls. The training will provide comprehensive information on topics important to aspiring entrepreneurs and small business owners related to business planning, access to capital, basic bookkeeping, human resources, problem solving and marketing a small business.
